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Users' Guide

(利用の手引き)

1. 本書の目的

ヨーロッパをはじめとして、世界中で広く用いられている外国語の教授、学習、評価のための枠組みであるCEFR (Common European Framework of Reference) のコンセプトに基づいた本教科書では、「できるようになりつつある」過程が実感できるようなタスク設計をもとに、自律的学習態度を促進します。また、ヨーロッパでCEFRと並んで取り入れられつつある内容と言語の学びの統合を実現するCLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) のアプローチを取り入れ、アカデミック英語として下位レベルから思考 (Cognition) を言語とともに育てます。

本教科書はシリーズとして編纂されており、本書ではCEFRの6段階のレベルのうち、自立した使用者の入り口(Threshold)であるB1レベルから、職業人としての英語使用を可能とするB2 (Vantage) レベルに至る過程のB1+レベルへと4技能を統合的に高めていくことを目指します。また、自立に至る途上のA2 (Waystage) レベルから自立したB1レベルに達する一歩手前のA2+レベルの学習者にも足場 (scaffolding) を提供することで、B1レベル、さらにはB1+レベルへと能力を伸ばしていくための糸口を作ります。

2. 本書の構成

本書は5章 (Chapter) から構成され、それぞれの章では、Technology (技術)、Health (健康)、Economics (経済)、Environment (環境)、Learning (学習) といった5つの分野の関連したテーマを3課 (Unit) にまたがって内容に関する理解を深めながら学んでいきます。

第1課では、まずリーディングを中心として、チャートを用いながらテキストを分析的に読み、口頭で説明するリプロダクションを通して、スピーキングへとつなげていく下地を作ります。また、授業外の学習として、関連した内容のインプットを自律的に読むトレーニングを行います。

第2課では、次にリスニングを中心に、質問を考えながら内容を分析的に聞き、サマリーを作成することで、ライティングへとつなげていく下地を作ります。また、授業外の学習として、関連した内容のインプットを参照しながら、文章を編集して書くトレーニングを行います。

第3課では、最後に第1課と第2課で学んだ内容を統合的に理解して、グループで情報整理や意見交換をし、協働しながらチャートを用いたプレゼンテーションを作成します。また、授業後には、発表した内容をもとにして、自分の意見を再度まとめて書くトレーニングを行います。

Is Social Networking Good for You?

Various concerns with social networking are voiced **vigorously** [a. frequently / b. silently / c. actively] these days. Students spend more time reading “tweets” and Facebook “statuses” than doing their homework. They seem to care more about what their friends’ friends are doing than to update themselves on the latest current events or jogging for 30 minutes. Social networking seems to make people’s minds numb.

Is this good for us? Is this a destruction of our creative and private lives? Not quite. In fact there are as many good points as bad points to social networking. First of all, social networking promotes communication among friends as well as family. Not all family members live together. The child who studies abroad can talk with his/her parents with Skype as if they were living together. Grandparents and grandchildren communicate easily even if they live far apart. Not all people are good at communicating in person. People who are shy and have difficulty in talking face to face may feel more at ease and more comfortable when communicating through the Internet. Social networking helps us communicate more and reinforce our relationships.

Some people may form a group to talk about works by famous architects and plan a short trip to visit buildings designed by them. Social networking makes it easy to communicate as well. 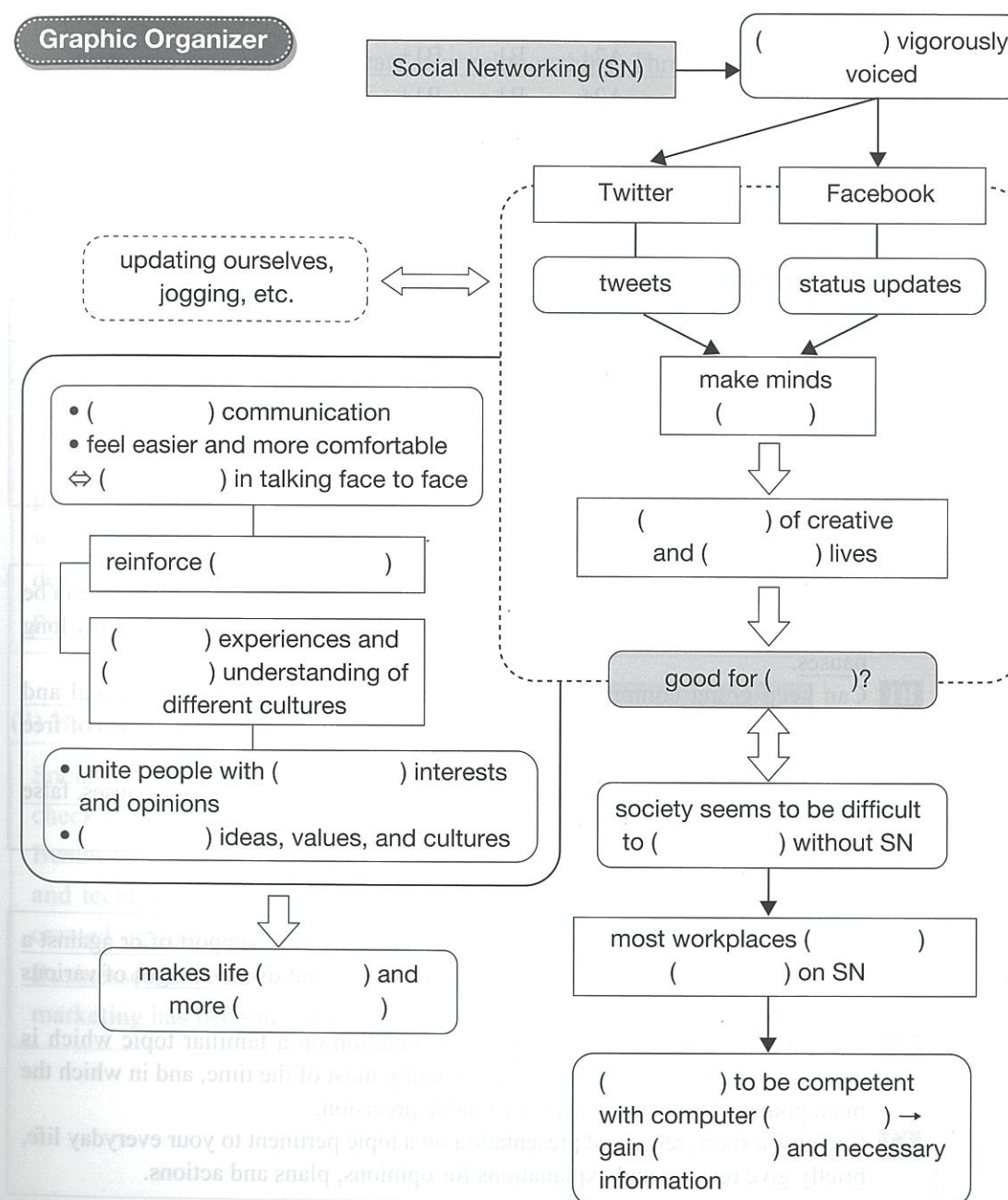
